

There Is A Redeemer

"It Is Well with My Soul"

The beloved hymn "It Is Well with My Soul" was written by Horatio Spafford (1828-1888) after enduring many trials and hardships. On November 15, 1873, Spafford's wife and four daughters boarded a luxury passenger ship, the Ville Du Havre. The Spaffords experienced significant financial loss in the Great Chicago Fire, and the trip to England was meant to restore health to Spafford's wife, Anna. Horatio was to join his family after attending to some business affairs.

On November 22, 1873, the Ville Du Havre was struck by a Scottish iron ship named the Loch Earn. Anna Spafford spoke of her children's courage as the ship sank.

"The dear children were so brave. They died praying. Annie said to Maggie and me just before we were swept off the steamer, "Don't be frightened, Maggie, God will take care of us, we can trust Him; and you know Mama, 'The Sea is His and He made it'" (Vester).

Anna Spafford felt her baby, Tanetta, being torn from her hands. Anna soon lost consciousness, and when she came to, she found herself in a boat without her children. It was then that she understood her children had perished.

The Ville Du Havre sank 12 minutes after the collision, leaving only 87 survivors of the 313 passengers and crew members. When Anna Spafford arrived in Wales, she sent a telegram to her husband stating, "Saved alone what shall I do ..." She then recounted the deaths of all four children as well as the others in their company.

Horatio immediately departed to be with his wife. In a letter to his sister, Horatio recalls passing over the spot where the ship sunk, "They are safe, folded, the dear lambs, and there, before very long, shall we be too. In the meantime, thanks to God, we have an opportunity to serve and praise Him for His love and mercy to us and ours" (Vester).

Ira D. Sankey, a singer and hymn writer, and pastor Dwight L. Moody visited and comforted the Spaffords during their time of loss. In 1876, a few years after the tragedy, Sankey spent some time with the Spaffords. Sankey recalls that it was during this visit that Horatio penned the hymn "It Is Well with My Soul" to remember the death of his children.
